



Spotlight on a Kiwanis Branch: Aktion Club

In addition to Key Club, Kiwanis has several other branches within the organization. This month's spotlight is on the Aktion Club.

Aktion Club is intended to serve adults with disabilities. The organization was started in 1987 by George D. "Jake" Swartout. Mr. Swartout was the Kiwanis Florida District Governor from 1988 until 1989.

The Aktion Club started out in Putnam County of Florida, but later spread throughout the entire state. Pretty soon, word of the organization spread throughout Kiwanis International. On October 1, 2000, Aktion Clubs were officially adopted as a branch of Kiwanis. Aktion Club is now present in eight countries including the United States. There are more than 500 Aktion Clubs worldwide with approximately 12,000 members.

Aktion Clubs function under the motto of "Where development has no disability." Despite any challenges that Aktion Club members face, they choose to serve others with a smile upon their face. In my opinion, Aktion Club is the true definition of service: always putting your servitude heart first.

I encourage you to take the time to find the Aktion Club in your division by reaching out to your local Kiwanis Club. If there is not an Aktion Club in your area, consider asking your local Kiwanis to help sponsor one.

Aktion Club members also participate in many district conferences that are similar to the Key Club conferences. Aktion Clubs are continuing to make positive and meaningful changes to our communities.

Take the chance to brainstorm goals for your club concerning the interaction that can be made with your local Aktion Club. 
The Key Club Member: YOU!

HOW KEY CLUB IS ORGANIZED



Key Club is broken down three branches. All of these branches connect to form Key Club International. To begin with, there is the club branch. This branch is composed of each individual Key Club that is typically run by a president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. Other Key Clubs may have additional club officer positions depending on the needs presented by the club. This branch is currently over 5,000 clubs strong. Clubs are organized by divisions and regions. Divisions are composed of individual Key Clubs that are located in approximately the same location. Regions are then composed of divisions that are in approximately the same location.

The next branch is the District. There are 33 Districts within in Key Club. Typically, Districts are separated by state and follows the District zoning that is allotted by Kiwanis. Our district is the Carolinas District, which is composed of Key Clubs in both North and South Carolina. The district branch is run by an executive board (governor, secretary, treasurer, and editor) and a group of Lieutenant Governors.

The final branch is Key Club International. This is the branch that governs every Key Club in the world. Key Club International is led by a president, vice president, and ten trustees. Key Club is a much bigger organization, than it might appear to be. It's amazing to think that an organization that's present in your high school is also present on the other side of the world. *You are part of something big!*

Goals for the 2016-2017 Year

The Three C's to Service

I am looking for a very successful year of service! My three goals for the year include:

Goal One: Communication

In order for our district to serve together, it is vital that an effective line of communication is established. This communication can be formed by ensuring that the Liaisons between the District Board and the individual Key Clubs, the Lieutenant Governors, are adequately trained on the information that they bring to their divisions. Service is all about having the ability to care. This is so, because service would not be possible without having an initial act of caring. It is important for every member to find the cause that they care most about and then simply serve! In short, never stop serving your homes, schools, and communities.

What's Next?...

The end of the year is a busy time, especially for seniors. This time is filled with moments that seniors have been looking forward to for what seems like forever; last day of school, last high school exam, college acceptance letters, **GRADUATION**, and the list goes on and on. In addition, the question of "What happens next?" seems to be tossed around quite a bit. Even though one chapter is closed, another chapter is just beginning.
