Key Club International Homecoming Campaign

If you are having trouble finding ways to welcome back club members after the last two school years, Key Club International has launched the perfect campaign for you: The Homecoming Campaign.

Please note that their live webinar dates pasted already, but here are some important information they put out to help you:

Make a "Homecoming Week" to build your Key Club, your club may offer activities that week to invite future members to learn more about Key Club. We recommend hosting a welcoming event at the end of the week that doubles as a service project to give potential members a glimpse of what Key Club is all about. Get people talking about Key Club! Here are some activities you can do:

- Monday
- Club.
- Decide on a service project to host on Friday and begin
- Create a media list and draft a news release to be sent on Friday.
- Follow up with the students you invited. Answer any questions they have about Key Club and highlight your favorite moments. Make sure they know you want to see them on Friday!
- Continue to plan your service project event.

- Make a list of past members and friends who might enjoy Key Create eye-catching materials to invite them to Key Club. Use personal club invites on social media and recruitment flyers to welcome students to your event on Friday.
 - Assign members to be in charge of the various tasks for a successful event on Friday.

Thursday

- Remind the students who said "yes" to the invitation of the event details and let them know how excited you are to see them tomorrow.
- Put final touches on your event.
- Execute your service project. When the students you invited arrive, be sure to thank them and make them feel welcome. Introduce them to other Key Club members so they feel a sense of belonging to your club.
- Distribute the news release you created on Monday to the media. And get back to service!

KEY CLUB® Fall Blueprint 2021 Update on Contact Information

The collection of contact information is extremely crucial in ensuring that our district works like a well oiled machine. As of December 1st, only roughly a quarter of clubs have updated contact information officially submitted. However, there is information from previous years from nearly every club. This information needs to be used, and it serves no use if emails are not being sent out weekly or bi-weekly attempting to confirm this information! The line of communication works both ways. Club presidents are responsible for reaching out to their Lieutenant Governors, and vice versa. Either club leaders or Lieutenant Governors can fill out their contact information form, but there's nothing wrong with submitting it twice, so fill it out if you're not sure if a club has been submitted! Dues must be paid every year in order for a club to remain in good standing. The early bird deadline was December 1st and the regular, required deadline for dues payment is January 1st. District dues are \$6.50 and are used to support district programs, general expenses, and training. International dues are \$7.00 and are used to support Key Club as an organizational whole. Dues are processed by Kiwanis International through both mail and the membership update center. Because all SLP clubs (Kiwanis, Circle K, Key Club, Builders Clubs, and K-Kids) in all of International pay dues the same way, dues can take a while to get processed, especially now that Kiwanis staff is meeting at home. 
This year's Key Club week was a success! Thank you for all the clubs that participated.



Lieutenant Governors are your biggest resources throughout the year. Each lieutenant governor is responsible for supporting and growing the clubs within his or her division and serving as a liaison between the district and the club. Duties include publication of a newsletter, club officer training and support, holding divisional meetings and serving on one or more district committees. Lieutenant Governors provide divisional updates through monthly newsletters, specific to each division, that hold tons of information from Division Wide Functions to Key Club International's events.
