Have you ever needed a service project idea? Look no further! Here's a list to help get you started!

- Hold a book drive for your local Boys and Girls Club. After delivering the books, set up times to read to the kids.
- Host a donation only carwash. Donate all profits to a charity of your choice!
- Design shirts they don't have to be Key Club related, and sell them at your school. Donate all profits to a charity of your choice.
- Partner with your sponsoring Kiwanis to collect canned food for your local soup kitchen. This is also the Carolinas Kiwanis District Project.
- Spend the afternoon at your local senior center or assisted living. Chat and play cards with the residents.
- Hold a seasonal bake sale and donate all of the profits to a charity of your choice.
- Hold a clothing drive and donate all of the clothes to your local resell store.
- Collect new or gently used toys and donate them to Toys for Tots.
- Collect household items and donate them to the "Country Store". (Boys and Girls Homes of NC Second-hand Store).
- Send care packages to deployed troops, veterans, or wounded soldiers, and write thank you notes for them.
- Hold a school supply drive for underprivileged students in your school.

- Host a gently used prom dress drive and donate the dresses to the Boys and Girls Homes of NC.
- Create care packages with basic necessities (i.e hygiene products like toothbrushes, deodorant, and tissues) to deliver to a homeless shelter.
- Volunteer at a local library to clean and shelf library books.
- Make simple felt blankets for local hospitals.
- Write cards for local retirement homes with encouraging and sweet messages.
- Host a talent show and charge for admission. Sell raffle tickets and ask local businesses or companies to donate prizes. Donate your profit to a charity of your choice.
