Dear Carolinas District,

I, like many Key Club members, have yet to enjoy a fully "normal" Key Club experience. For that reason, I hope that we will return to in-person events, even though there are still many unknowns.

However, with last year's fully virtual district board, and partially virtual school clubs, an uncharacteristically large percentage of contact information was left unreported or unconfirmed. At the end of the previous Key Club term, roughly a third of all clubs had not submitted their information. This is in no part due to the previous District Board and Secretary, all of whom did an outstanding job and went absolutely above and beyond. Due to many clubs taking a hiatus of sorts, this information was left unsubmitted. Unsubmitted information can make it difficult for our current Lieutenant Governors to reach out and work with their clubs. Luckily, many clubs that didn't submit information during the 2020-2021 year did submit information during the 2019-2020 year. I will be working with Lieutenant Governors to give them access to this information, so that we are able to bring the percentage of clubs with submitted information back to pre-pandemic levels.

It is my goal to bring contact information submission levels to at least 90% of what they were in the 2019-2020 year. With cooperation between clubs, Lieutenant Governors, and Executive Officers, I believe that we can do this!



Lieutenant Governor Distribution of Clubs

Your club's Lieutenant Governor you may run into the issue of trying to find the nearest Kiwanis Club in relation to a school or trying to figure out the location of all the Key Clubs in your division. You may also run into the issue of trying to hold an event with other clubs but can't figure out the ideal location. The District Map can help answer such questions! There are 4 District Maps in total, to find them, ask your Lieutenant Gov. to look up "District Map" in their email inbox!



Maps are organized by region & are color coded by each region's division. This map is a great way to see what

location the schools listed in your division are in and to know where the corresponding divisions in your regions are. It can be useful to planning locations for PCM or DWFs to see which location would be most ideal for partnering up with other clubs.

For Lieutenant Governors, this maps shows the locations of high schools you may be able to charter a Key Club at as well as the possibility of the amount of Key Clubs the Carolinas District could have. This map removes the problem of not being able to find a Key Club to charter.

Roles of Club Officers

Club officers are vital to the success of each club that they lead. They act as role models and resources to all of the club's members. It is important that each officer knows the responsibilities of their position in order to maximize the success during their term! Club presidents and vice-presidents will be especially important in this upcoming school year as we return to normalcy.

You have the power to lead your club to new heights as an officer team!

President

- Lead all the meetings and discussions
- Write agendas for meetings
- Meet with divisional Lieutenant Governor for President Council Meeting

Vice President

- Assist the president in their responsibilities
- Lead meetings in the absence of the president
- Ensure effective communication between the officer team and the general membership

Secretary

- Take meeting minutes
- Keep track of attendance and member service hours
- Update club records
- Submit club monthly reports (found on www.carolinaskeyclub.org/new-club-monthly-reports)
- Submit Annual Achievement
- Report at the end of the year

Treasurer

- Collect and keep track of membership dues
- Take a record of club funds
- Ensure the club stays in good financial standing
- Update your sponsoring Kiwanis Club's of your club's financial status

Editor

- Distribute information to members
- Update and run club social media
- Spotlight and take pictures at events
- Ensure accurate and relevant information is continuously broadcasted

Uputh Apportunities Fund

The Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF) is an endowed fund of the Kiwanis Children's Fund which provides grants to Key Club and Key Club members for scholarships and service opportunities. YOF grants can help your club take action in your community. Before you apply for the grant, first identify a service that needs to be done in your school, community or the world. Then apply for the YOF grant to help make a change in your school, community, or the world!

Grant basics:

- Grant amounts can range between \$250-\$2000
- Applications must be submitted online by October 15 at 11:59 EST
- Grant applicants are emailed of outcomes the first week of January
- The previous years dues must be paid before grant checks can be issued
- The Youth Opportunity Fund Grant report is due January 1st

Get ready to apply:

Applications can be completed online in Foundant. Foundant is an online grant making system. To begin an application in Foundant, you must first create a club account. You can create an account from the Logon Page by clicking "create new account."

Once your account is created, you can login, the click on "apply" and choose you preferred application language from the available selection. You will need to know your Key Club name, ID number and District to begin the application. You can find this information on the membership Update center.

Mow the grass for elderly neighbors


